

6 DISCOVER & EXPLORE A-Z Databases click

The <u>A-Z Databases</u> page is the main place to find and access databases.

You can:

- locate a database by its title from an alphabetical list
- choose from the Subject list at left of page, or use the Subject drop-down
- find databases of a particular type, eg. Streaming Video; EBooks
- go to **popular databases** from a list at the right of the page.



7 GET TO KNOW ABOUT DATABASES

What are Library Databases?

"Library databases (also known as bibliographic databases) are organised collections of information and links to published literature, such as journal or newspaper articles. Items indexed in databases usually include a citation, abstract and often a link to the full-text of the item. Databases are produced by major academic publishers and vendors and are aligned to specific subject areas, disciplines and even types of sources."

There are different types of databases:

- Full-text contains the full-text of journal articles etc., often able to download as PDF.
- Indexing and abstracting offer details about the item but not the full-text.
- Audio-visual allow you to download or stream images, video or sound.


Some databases are freely accessible, while others are paid for by your university.

The USP library subscribes to 73 online databases available to all registered USP students and staff. By using the resources, you have access to a wider base of scholarly literature to use for your assignments.

8 CONTACT YOUR SCHOOL LIAISON LIBRARIAN

Your <u>Liaison Librarian</u> guides you to key resources in your subject area where they recommend the top databases for your field. There are also subject guides which are excellent starters to find resources for your subject.
