



4 PREPARATION TIPS FOR EXAMS

Regional students at other campuses should contact their Campus Admin Office or their Student Administrative Services office(r) for their examination venue.

Note that the exam venue shown on your personal timetable is only for **Laucala Campus** students.

- Be on time. You should be at the exam venue at least
 1/2 an hour before each exam starts
- Make sure you appear at the correct time and date for your examination
- Make sure you have a USP photo ID
 Other materials allowed into the exam venue:
- DO NOT bring any valuables or bags to the examination venue because USP is not responsible for this
- Do not bring any mobile phone, laptop, tablet or any other electronic device into the examination venue
- If you are doing an online *Final Test*, ensure that the keyboard and desktop are working well.

5 Discover & Navigate Your Databases & eResources

The library eResources webpage lists the types of electronic and online resources which are readily available to you to browse, search and use.

There are six access headings namely:

- A-Z databases
- Find Journals and eBooks
- Exam Papers
- Open Access and Open Educational Resources
- USP Theses Portal
- <u>PIMRIS</u> which holds the Moana database, PIMRIS regional repository and USP Aquatic repository

There are different types of databases:

- Full-text contains the full-text of journal articles etc., that you are often able to download as PDF.
- Indexing and abstracting offer details about the item but not the full-text.
- Audio-visual allow you to download or stream images, video, or sound.


