MASTER OF ARTS IN DIPLOMACY AND INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS

The Master of Arts in Diplomacy and International Affairs builds on the foundational courses in the Postgraduate Diploma in Diplomacy and International Affairs by adding an opportunity to undertake a research essay on diplomacy and international affairs on a topic of particular interest to the student. This program also provides research skills and advanced writing skills. In addition, Master of Arts in Diplomacy and International Affairs students also have the opportunity to follow an interest in a particular academic stream by clustering their electives in particular disciplines or subject areas such as Law, Environment, Economics or Development Studies.

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS:

There are five compulsory courses:

- 1) PL409: Diplomacy, Negotiations and Statecraft
- 2) PL410: World Politics and International Relations
- 3) EC416: WTO and Trade Liberalisation in Developing Countries
- 4) PL400: Regional Diplomacy in the Pacific islands
- 5) PL411: Research Essay in Diplomacy and International Affairs

And three elective courses selected from:

- DG422: Environmental Change and Green Development

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- A Postgraduate Diploma in Diplomacy and International Affairs with a cumulative GPA of at least 3.0
- Or equivalent qualification

DURATION

- Four years on a part-time basis
- Two years on a full-time basis

RECOMMENDED COURSE LOAD

- Part-time: one course per semester
- Full-time: two courses per semester

TEACHING DELIVERY

Classes are held once a week in the evening (5-7pm). The class typically comprises a lecture and interactive discussion.

ASSESSMENT

Typically includes two essays and an examination in each course.
