CALLS FOR APPLICATIONS: CERTIFICATE IV IN TRAINING & ASSESSMENT

The Pacific-European Union Marine Partnership Programme (PEUMP) at the Institute of Marine Resources (IMR) in collaboration with USP Pacific TAFE is pleased to invite applications from **marine and fisheries management personnel across the 15 Pacific-ACP countries** for the Certificate IV in Training & Assessment (CTA) programme. The CTA programme is to be offered by cohort basis (8 weeks) from the **14th October to the 6th of December, 2019**.

DESCRIPTION:

This programme reflects the roles of individuals delivering training and assessment services in skills based qualifications and programmes. The skills set derived from the units of competencies within the programme is also suitable for those engaged in the delivery of training and assessment of competence in a workplace context, as a component of a structured skills based programme. This qualification provides a pathway for employment as a trainer in the TVET or in the workplace.

ELIGIBILITY/ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

To be admitted to this programme a person shall have: (i) Pass in Senate recognized Form 6/Year 12 or equivalent with English and minimum of two years work experience; or (ii) Extensive workplace, TVET or adult training experience with recommendation from the employer.

COURSE INFORMATION

The 4 courses of the programme are: CET41 – Design & Develop a Learning Programme; CET42 – Processes & Methodologies of Training; CET43 – Plan and Deliver Training; CET44 – Assessment, Evaluation, Validation & Training.

ONLINE SESSIONS: 7 weeks (14th October to the 6th of December, 2019)

FACE TO FACE SESSION: 1 week (4th to the 8th of November, 2019)

The project will cover tuition fees and face-to-face session costs of the programme.
