#### **PROGRAMME DESCRIPTION**

This qualification provides learners with opportunities to continue to engage in the workforce and/or

to assist, coordinate and lead teams in communities and government agencies to undertake specific roles.

These include:

- gathering relevant information and data for monitoring and reporting of projects in Resilience;
- providing general and specific information, communications, and services to communities, government and development partners on a particular field of Resilience;
- developing community awareness on matters related to vulnerability, climate change adaptation, mitigation and disaster risk reduction; and
- support implementation and monitoring of resilience building (CCA and DRR) projects.

#### CAREER ADVANCEMENT

This programme is targeted towards those working in the Resilience sector including but not limited to, Public Service Officers, Technical Assistant, Advisory Councilor, Community Engagement Officer, Disaster Management Officer, and Disaster Volunteer.

#### **ELIGIBILITY/ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS**

To be admitted to this programme, a person:

- (i) Pass in Senate recognised year 12 with English and a minimum of 2 years of relevant work experience; or
- (ii) Met the mature student admission criteria; or
- (iii) Completion of Certificate III in Resilience: or
- (iv) Any special case where the above requirements are not met can be approved on case-by-case basis.
