The All Night Reading Room at the Main Library is also open from Monday to Thursday, 10:00 p.m. - 7.00 a.m. and closed all other days.

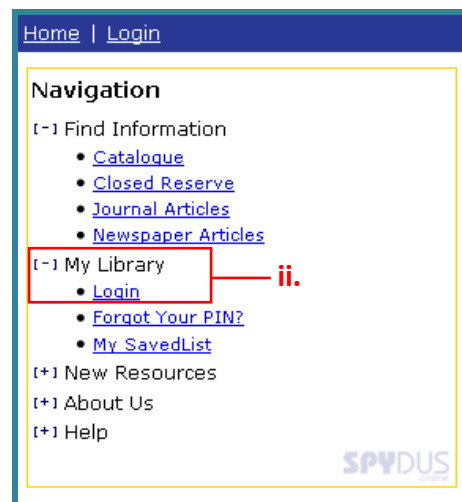

Library Catalogue: login & check your record



- i. Access the [Library Catalogue](#).
- ii. On the navigation panel, on the left, open the 'My Library' menu and select 'Login'.
- iii. Enter your Borrower ID and PIN.

Note:

- Your Borrower ID is the barcode on the front of your staff/student card, beginning with US and ending with P with digits in between. Enter the digits only.
 - Your PIN is your staff/student number. Enter the letter H or S with the digits.
- iv. On 'My Account' page, the Summary tab allows you to see your current loans, overdue titles (if any), and whether your reservations are available for pick up.
