Ako toutai limu tanga'u

Na' e fakahoko 'e he Potungaue ha ako ki he kau toutai limu tanga'u kotoa pe 'i Tongatapu ni, 'o fekau'aki mo e mahu'inga ke nau tokanga'i 'a e tu'unga lelei 'o 'enau limu ki hono uta atu ki muli.

Na' e lava ke ako'i kinautolu ki he founa hono toutai'i 'o e limu ka e pehe ki he ngaahi me'a nguae 'oku tali 'e he lao ke nau nguae'aki.

Hili 'a e ako na' e lava 'o fa'u 'a e pine faka'ilonga (ID) kiate kinautolu na' e kau he ako ke fakamahino ki he ngaahi kautaha fua limu, kuo ngofua ke nau fakatau meiate kinautolu. Ko e founa ko 'eni na'e fakahoko ia 'i he felotoi 'a e ngaahi kautaha fua limu taautaha pea mo e Potungaue.

Seaweed Training

The Ministry of Fisheries conducted several training sessions for all seaweed harvesters in Tongatapu. This training is important to ensure that the best quality of seaweed is exported.

The training educated people on the best methods to harvest the seaweed and also the reason certain techniques are forbidden by law.

Upon completion of training the people were given identification cards (ID). The possession of an ID card allows seaweed companies to purchase from these harvesters.

This arrangement is a condition of the licence of seaweed processing companies.

However, this illegal activity of fishing small lobster and selling them in the market is very common and they continue to pay fines in court for their irresponsible action.

Inspection of limu tanga'u

Fisheries inspector start patrolling of seaweed harvesting at Tongatapu. The inspectors wish to insure that harvesters are following the law and that harvesters selling to processors are in possession of their identification card (ID)

This patrolling includes monitoring of methods and equipment. Using rakes or any implement that harms sea grass habitat is forbidden by law.

Renewal fish fence licence

Annual renewal of fish fences licence usually occurs between August—September every year, but due to civil servant strike it was deferred to September—October this year.

Fisheries inspector start patrolling compliance with fish fence licences around Tongatapu in November.

Under Ministry of Fisheries authority, fisheries inspectors can remove fish fence if there is not a current valid licence for it.

Poloseki Waqa / Project Waqa

Poloseki Waqa 'a Ha'apai

Kuo lava lelei 'a e konga 'uluaki ki hono monomono / fo'u e fanga ki'i vaka toutai 'e 30 na'e uesia 'e he saikolone Waqa 'i Ha'apai.

Pea 'oku kamata leva 'a e ngaue ki he konga hono ua, 'a ia na'e tali 'e he komiti ke monomono 'a e vaka 'e 6 mei he tohi kole 'e 30 na'e fakahu mai.

'I he konga 'uluaki na'e fe'unga 'a e fakamole kotoa ki ai moe \$133,097, pea 'i he konga ua kuo 'oatu ai 'a e \$50,000 ki ai.

'I he polokalama tatau pe 'i Vava'u na' e tolo'i fakataimi, ka kuo kamata 'a e ngaue ki ai 'o feinga ke fakakakato 'a e fanga ki'i vaka na' e tali 'e he komiti Waqa 'a Vava'u 'i he konga 'uluaki.


Ha'apai Project Waqa

Phase one on project Waqa at Ha'apai has being completed on build and repairing 30 fishing vessels.

Phase two has just begun and now 6 fishing boats out of 30 fishing boat all together that have applied for assistance from the project.

Total expenses for phase one were \$133,097, but for phase two we already transferred \$50,000 for a start.

There was a same program run at Vava'u, but it was temporary delayed. Currently they start work on it and tried to complete fishing boats that has been accepted by Vava'u Waqa committee at phase one.
