POCCA aims to enhance Pacific Island Countries' resilience to climate change by promoting effective evidence-based decision making through a comprehensive assessment of climate extremes' impact on the Pacific people, land and ocean.

The assessment will identify and share existing practices of Pacific resilience by collating research, community experiences, and indigenous knowledge.

This initiative will provide a basis for an evidence-based approach to support a sustainable future for Pacific communities and create a Pacific Islands Climate and Ocean Assessment to empower vulnerable countries in the Pacific to address the existential threat of climate change.
